Vision Exam Versus Medical Eye Exam

A Vision Exam is performed to determine if a patient requires glasses, contacts, or a new prescription to see clearly. This is called a refraction. It also evaluates the general health of the eye. Typically, a vision insurance plan can be used once a year or once every two years.

If there's a medical problem with your eye, then it will be billed to your medical insurance. It is the doctors' diagnosis that will determine the type of visit and which insurance will be billed.

Refraction

Often insurance companies do not allow for both medical and vision exams to be billed on the same day. If you would like to get your prescription updated on the same day as your medical visit, you will be charged \$50 for your refraction, along with your co-pay. Otherwise, you could use your vision insurance on a subsequent visit and be responsible for the co-pay.
